Student Perspective

Grade 9 Old Port Field Trip Oct. 28. 2022 (French Class)

- The majority of grade 9 was given the opportunity to attend this field trip
- The outing was very successful, both educationally relating to their French & History curriculum as well as being a fun outing to discover our city of

Montreal

- Ms. Benami's two French classes were not given the opportunity to attend
 this trip due to the fact their teacher was on leave for multiple weeks &
 the class was being run by a substitute
- The students of these classes were not given any notice of this activity
 & only learned about it from their peers
- They are very upset at this missed opportunity & don't even understand
 why it happened. It is unclear if their teacher simply did not want to
 participate or if the organizers of the trip did not include them, in either
 case it is unacceptable that they be excluded for seemingly no reason
- Lack of brown paper towels in bathrooms:
- In most bathrooms, the paper towel dispensers seem to run out every day
 after lunch, if they're stocked at all. Other times paper towel rolls are
 simply left on the counter, & unfortunately are often misused by
 students. Additionally, the dispensers seem to break or get vandalized
 often. All in all, the hand drying situation is sub-par

New Bathroom Usage Policy

- The idea is that students should use break times to go to the bathroom,
 & so during periods that fall adjacent to these times students are not allowed to leave class to use the restroom. (Which ends up being most of the periods.)
- Presumably, this policy is to reduce the amount of stragglers who loiter in the bathrooms or the halls during class
- This change is not very popular among students, it limits the freedoms of everyone for the sake of controlling a loud minority
- Primarily, it sets a precedent for teachers to simply not allow students to use
 the facilities, without question. Of course judgment can be used to make
 exceptions when needed, but this only adds more complication to the
 already uncomfortable question of asking a teacher to use the washroom
- Ultimately, this does not seem to be affecting how likely teachers are to allow someone to go to the washroom, & it depends more on the individual teacher, just like so many other classroom policies

Athletics:

- Boy's Juvenile Volleyball team: The season is over, the team was passionate but not very successful
- The players feel they were not given sufficient practice time even though most of them were extremely motivated to do so. This seems to have been due to a lack of gym access & scheduling
